For directions see here: Diddington is located 1 mile south of the roundabout at Buckden on the A1 and is a few miles north of St Neots. It is safer approaching Diddington from the north on a first visit to avoid crossing the A1 central reservation, indeed it may be more relaxing if driving from the south to go up to the roundabout and go all the way round to go 1 mile south again

From the slip road into the Village you go down the Village Road for approx. 400 meters, past a row of 3 white cottages and after the School House on the right hand side you see the Old Village Hall, 1<sup>st</sup> arrivals can park on the tarmac and once this is full there is plenty of parking on the grass along the far side wall of the hall.
